## Administration

The interlocal agreement for automatic aid from Aberdeen Fire Department has been received and sent to legal for review. It should be ready for approval at the April Commissioners' meeting.

Once again, this year, there is a Mobilization Cooperations Interlocal Agreement to accept. This is the same agreement that was established by Chief Hatley in 2022. There has been more interest from other Grays Harbor County fire departments. The agreement was written up by our legal and is ready for approval.

An interlocal agreement with the City of Aberdeen is ready for approval dealing with the IT services for the apparatus modem service. This was a project that was started under the term of Chief Hubbard. This will allow the district to use the City of Aberdeen's services for data activities in the Medic units.

After reviewing the two companies that presented on policy and procedure management, I have been able to choose a vendor to use in the future. We will need to work on budgeting for this service for 2024 or, if possible, even this year.

Facilities:

Station 2-3 – A committee was formed to progress on the water rights for the station. Questions have been submitted to legal to determine how the Fire District can proceed. More to come later.
